Progress Report on Church Office and Toilets Project.

No doubt you will have seen the architectural drawings on one of the notice boards in the church foyer? The plans were placed there in December so that all members of the church family could review them and comment if they so wished. In short, the intention is to

- to create a new (third) office, primarily for administration plus the Christians Against Poverty (CAP) and other outreach projects of Christ Church, and
- (ii) improve the toilets, including a new one for disabled access.

The good news is that the technical plans have now been approved by the building regulators, and they have also been recommended for going ahead by the Diocesan Advisory Committee at Lincoln. The next step is for there to be a formal 28-day period of consultation, and a corresponding notice will therefore soon be put up in the church foyer to announce this. And now we need to raise the required funds for the building work actually to be done! Including construction work, professional fees and equipment etc., the total cost of the project is estimated to be about £34,000. So far, we have secured about £7,000, with another £6,000 likely to be confirmed in the near future. A request for a grant of £17,000 has also been submitted to Lincolnshire County Council, but we do not yet know the outcome. If successful, then there would be a shortfall of just £4,000 still to be covered. We are hoping that all of the funds will be secured in time for the building work to be done in the summer holidays, and that it will be finished by early September. Please pray hard that we are able to raise the required funds and that we are able to keep to this ambitious schedule!

The Passover Supper

Again this year we will be celebrating the Passover Supper on Maundy Thursday.

The Passover Supper, also called the Seder, has been celebrated by the Jews since the Exodus. It is the Hebrew Thanksgiving, giving thanks to god for deliverance and redemption. It commemorates the protection of God as the Angel of Death passed over every Hebrew family in Egypt protected by the blood of the Pascal Lamb. It is in this family setting that Jewish children are first introduced to the Book of Exodus as the adults tell the story year after year.

Jesus was celebrating the Passover Supper at the meal we now refer to as The Last Supper. This was the time Jesus chose to announce the New Covenant. And it was at this Seder that Jesus asked all of us to do *this in remembrance of Him.* This year we will use the Passover Supper as our Communion Service and at 8pm there will be a Quiet Hour in the church.

#### Teenzone

Teenzone has changed its opening time to provide more opportunities for 14-19 year olds. We are now open Mondays and Wednesdays 3-5pm for y9+ before our younger sessions 5-7pm for y5-y9. On a Thursday we will open 3-4pm as a careers-focused session, giving those in year 9 and above opportunity to search for employment, write a CV, or do coursework or other education/employment focused work. This session is to be run in partnership with New College Stamford, who will give us one of their employees once a month to help the young people make more use out of the session. Following this we are to be open from 4pm-7pm for y9+ once again to offer a more chilled out session than that for our younger ones.

This summer we are working towards a large scale festival for young people to be held at the Recreation Ground. We are in the process of raising £13,000 to run this festival, which will have a subtle aim to empower young people to learn more about issues surrounding them such as drinking, drugs, smoking and health issues. The festival will be on the 27th August...more updates to follow!!!

Additionally to the festival we are also in the process of raising money to hold our summer holiday programme.

Attendance wise - we are higher than ever. Each Monday we are averaging attendance at 80 young people between 5pm and 9.30pm during our cafe and sports sessions, and additionally on a Wednesday around 45. This is something we take great pride in.

# The Bishop of Lincoln's Easter Letter

I am not good in the dark. I remember when I first arrived in Hampshire to be a vicar of a market town, having lived for 20 years in the lit-up world of cities, having to go one winter's evening to a deanery synod in one of what were called 'the hill parishes'. I stepped out of the car into a remote field and it was absolutely black. I was by myself, completely disorientated, seriously bad-tempered and about to stagger back to my car, thinking 'I never really liked the deanery synod - I am going home', when a mysterious figure with a torch appeared and I found my way to the village hall. I am sure many of us have had similar experiences of suddenly and surprisingly finding ourselves lost in the dark and not knowing where to go.

The story of Good Friday and Easter is about the move from darkness to light. The darkness is the death of Christ, in which the human race appears to be lost, disorientated, and unhappy and about to give up on the spiritual journey. The light is the light of Christ, died and now risen. It is the light through which Christ finds us, gives us direction and hope and invites us to follow him on the journey - the journey of death and resurrection into the presence of His and our heavenly Father.

May we journey from the darkness of Good Friday into the light of Easter and experience the joy of the risen Lord. Alleluia!
