Bishops Letter

Dear friends,

It has been a productive year for some of Lincolnshire's farmers. I do not profess to be any kind of agricultural expert, but as Bishop of Lincoln I felt a real sense of pride when I heard recently of Tim Lamyman - one of our own, farming on the Wolds - and his new world record wheat and oilseed rape yields. That will make an awful lot of bread, biscuits and cake, for which the country, and I especially, am very grateful. In the south of the diocese, I see fields bursting with pumpkins, and I look with satisfaction at the Brussels sprouts, some of which will inevitably end up on our dining tables at Christmas.

But while some farmers are celebrating a fabulous harvest, and the rest of us gratefully look forward to our Christmas feasts, others continue to feel the pinch of the impact of national and international markets on our relatively small part of the world. Lincolnshire's dairy farmers might be wondering if their long hours will ever be profitable again. Cereal growers might wonder if costs will ever stop rising, while the value of their crops and hard work remains depressed.

The harvest festival was once a genuine thanksgiving to God for the success of a small scale crop, and food for the cold winter months. Now crops have been bred to be more reliable, techniques and land stewardship more scientifically advanced, and sales more predictable (even if prices are low), has God become less relevant? What is it that we're *really* celebrating at the harvest festival?

For me, the harvest festival should be a vital part of our calendar to remind us all that the world we have inherited is a wonderful place, that our land provides all the food we need, and that our work is done not only to feed our families, but also to the glory of the God who made us, and who made the land of which we're custodians for a fraction of a fraction of history. Please remember, and pray for, those who don't have enough to eat, those who are anxious about the future, and for your own stewardship of the gifts you have. And let's also celebrate how fabulous Lincolnshire and its farmers are at producing food.

Devotional

Ephesians 4:1-16 A healthy life

What are the characteristics of a healthy church?

Paul tells us how the church can grow up healthy in God. (v 16 Msg)

1. Unity

Unity is not simply the work of the Holy Spirit but the very instrument of which the Holy Spirit works. The Holy Spirit unites the church (v16). The church is one.

"There is one body and one spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." (v4-6).

Unity is relational. All Christians are sons and daughters of one God and father of all. Therefore we are all brothers and sisters. We all love one lord, Jesus. We all have the Holy Spirit living within us. Ultimately it's our relationship to God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit that unites us.

And yet, unity is so hard in practise. It's easy to argue. It's easy to split. It's easy to start our own group with people who agree with us. Unity requires great effort. Paul urges us to make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace (v3). We need to spare no effort to make the invisible unity of the church visible at every level – within local churches, between churches, and amongst all denominations.

Before he went to the cross, Jesus prayed that the church would be one in order that the world might believe (John 17:21-23). This unity is founded in God's unity, so it can never be at the expense of truth (v17). We must continue to speak the truth in love (Eph 4:15). As John Stott writes, "Truth becomes hard if it's not softened by love. Love becomes soft if it's not strengthened by truth." However, the visible unity of the church should always be our aim.

Paul describes characteristics that help this unity: "Be completely humble and gentle. Be patient, bearing with one another in love. (verse 2).

2. Diversity

Unity does not mean uniformity. The Holy Spirit brings both unity and diversity. Paul goes on to say, "To each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it (v7). Jesus has ascended higher than all the heavens (v10) but he also returned to the earth in the person of the Holy Spirit through whom different gifts are now given to each of us in the church" (10-12).

Every single person in the church is a minister. You are a minister. The word for service means ministry. We are all given different gifts.

3. Maturity

The purpose of these gifts is that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith, and in the knowledge of the son of God, becoming mature as we attain the complete measure of the fullness of Christ. It is not enough to get older. We need to grow up in spiritual maturity through growing in our relationship with Jesus.

4. Growth

Healthy children grow. Healthy churches grow in depth and in number. Church growth should be natural. This is a beautiful picture of how we each play our own part in the growth of the body of Christ. Speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the head, and that is, Christ. From him the whole body joined and held together by every

supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. (v15-16)

Prayer

Lord, help us to exercise the gifts that you have given us, to be released into the ministry you have called us.

Help us to grow into mature knowledge of Jesus in a healthy, united and growing church.
